



Terry Jarvis worked spent 33 years working for the New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services in a variety of positions. She taught individuals wishing to become Registered Nurses, established emergency medical service units throughout the state and for 20 years worked in the state's licensing and certification bureau. As the unit's Bureau Chief, she was responsible for administering the overall planning, coordination and evaluation of Residential Care and Health Facility licensing and certification functions for a variety of providers within the Bureau of Health Facilities – Licensing Department. Terry also oversaw the Life Safety Code program within the Bureau and acted as the department's representative on health facilities licensing and certification issues to federal and state agencies, state legislators, local municipal officials, professional organizations and the media.

For over 7 years Terry served as the Emergency Management Director for her community. In that position she was responsible for the revision of the town's Emergency Operation Plan and Hazard Mitigation plan, so it complied with state and federal standards. Terry also developed the town's mass inoculation plan, coordinating resources with surrounding communities.

As a 35-year member of New Hampshire's Fire Services Terry is certified as a career level Fire Fighter, Fire Inspector II and Nationally Registered Emergency Medical Technician.

Currently Terry is working on some incredible projects: as a staff instructor at the New Hampshire Fire Academy, conducting school based Public Health Network immunization clinics and helping the American Red Cross with disaster nursing.
