



Not Conducting During COVID-19 Restrictions

- **Michigan**: For non-CMS related activities, while on-site inspections are occurring, use of off-site techniques, including virtual inspections, has been used whenever possible since March 2020.
- Nevada: All facilities except for SNF, following guidance from CMS.
- **Tennessee**: Complaint surveys are being conducted for those complaints rising to an immediate jeopardy level. For re-inspections, depending on the severity of the deficiencies cited an on-site might occur.



- Florida: Virtual or telephonic inspections along with desk review are options for "routine" inspections
- **Maine**: We are currently only conducting a maximum of two inspections/complaints per day.
- **Michigan**: For non-CMS related activities, while on-site inspections are occurring, use of off-site techniques, including virtual inspections, has been used whenever possible since March 2020.
- **Mississippi:** Only serious complaint inspections (injury or death of a child or an immediate health risk) are conducted by an on-site inspection.
- **Ohio:** We are doing a hybrid model for some inspections that some documentation may be assessed off-site prior to the inspection.
- **Utah**: We are conducting full on-site inspections in most cases. If needed, we will conduct a virtual inspection.
